3. Course Description

The role of theory in research. The choice of a research problem. Design of research projects. Use of a range of research methods.

Students completing this course will:

- Understand the role of theory in research;
- Be able to identify appropriate research problems;
- Become familiar with the range of qualitative research methods appropriate to investigating research problems in library and information science;
- Understand the ethical issues related to research, especially research involving humans;
- Be able to examine critically and discuss qualitative research;
- Be able to design a basic research project, collect and analyze data.

Assignments will consist of a multi-phase pilot study and evidence of class preparation and participation.
